1. Opening of the Plenary and appointment of the Chair

The President Eddy Moors is appointed as Chair of the meeting and opens the General Assembly.

2. Approval of the record of the last General Assembly (December 2022)

The record of the previous General Assembly is read by Executive Director Eriberto Eulisse and is unanimously approved by the present members with the abstention of those who were not present.

3. New WAMU-NET Members: presentation and welcome

No.13 new members (from Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Cuba, Finland, Indonesia, Italy, Slovenia, and USA) joined the WAMU-NET during the 1st semester 2023. 5. The contribution of WAMU-NET to the UN 2023 Water Conference in New York (22-24 March)

"The Walk of Water: An Intergenerational Journey" is the title of the exhibition organized at the UN 2023 Water Conference in New York on 22-24 March. The exhibition is an example of how art, water and science can be used to share clear messages on the state of the world's water throughout time and across generations. Through a thematic journey dedicated to the past, the present and the future of water, a selection of works submitted by all WAMU-NET members in the previous editions of the youth contest *The Water We Want* and the worldwide exhibition *I Remember Water* (2022) have been showcased in the exhibition. The UNESCO Deputy Director General, Mr. Xing Qu, visited the exhibition during its opening on 22 March 2023, what marks an important achievement for WAMU-NET. The President Moors congratulates Eriberto and his team to make this possible in a very short time and with limited financial resources. The Vicepresident Chen Yongming confirmed the exhibition was an ideal setting to meet the Minister of Water Resources of China.

The WoW was developed by UNESCO WWAP (World Water Assessment Programme) and the European Commission's Joint Research Centre in collaboration with WAMU-NET, IHE Delft Institute for Water Education, Water Science Policy, and other six partners, and is supported by the Arts Coalition for Water. 6. Discussion on WAMU-NET activities under Priority 2 'Water Sustainability Education' (IHP 9)

Director Eulisse and Alexander Otte present the IHP Strategic Plan Phase 9 (2022-29) focusing in particular on its Priority 2 'Education for Water Sustainability'. WAMU-NET is included among the "Key Activities and outputs" of Priority Area n.2. WAMU-NET is explicitly mentioned as follows: "UNESCO-designated sites and the Global Network of Water Museums will be mobilized in raising awareness and improving water culture of citizens." (§ 119, p.25). "IHP-IX encourages a broad conception of water education to favor a change in behaviors towards a society with greater ecosocial awareness [...] supporting the development of interdisciplinary materials such as guidelines, briefing papers, and case studies on leading practices in water education for mass media contributing raising awareness of public at large." Specific activities planned by WAMU-NET and its members will be reported to OETWG 2 (Open-Ended Thematic Working Group No. 2).

7. Follow up of the WGs established in Marrakech

President Moors invites all WAMU-NET members to join the Working Groups established in Marrakech. The WGs set during the 4th WAMU-NET conference with the respective rapporteurs are on: Water Sustainability Education (A.Otte); World Inventory (J.Morato); African Network



(A.Benqlilou); Cross border engagement (V.Croitoru); Museums responses to crises (J.Lessa). In particular, it's expected the Education WG will organize a webinar on this topic by the end of 2023.

8. Discussion on ongoing projects and next activities

The discussion focuses on WAMU-NET's potential contribution to the next World Water Forum in Bali, May 2024, and on the EU-funded project, CREDIT. This is a small-scale project funded under the Creative Programme of the EU and will focus on the digitization of water-related natural and cultural heritage of museums. Other WAMU-NET partners include HYDRIA Greece; AQUATIKA Croatia; and the Water Factory Bologna, Italy. Activities include training courses, workshops and digitization campaigns: they will provide opportunities and potential benefits to all WAMU-NET members.

9. Status of 2023 annual Membership contributions (received until June 26th)

Membership contributions collected so far for the year 2023 amount to € 28.032. Expected memberships at 31.12.2023: € 34.000. The difference will be collected during the 2nd semester.

10. Report on 2022 annual Membership contributions

In 2022, WAMU-NET counted 82 members (71 institutions + 11 individual members). Membership contributions collected in 2022 amount to € 28.145. It's noted there are five pending membership contributions to be still collected for 2022, totaling € 1.950.

11. Approval of the final budget for the year 2022 (art.16)

Director Eulisse presents the balance sheet for 2022, which shows a final loss of (-) \leq 938. However, considering the 5 memberships that are still pending for 2022 (totalling \leq 1.950), it is noted that the final budget would have registered a final surplus of approx. (+) \leq 1.000. The Director stresses that WAMU-NET is still suffering from the lack of adequate staff. The President and the members of the MB congratulate Eulisse on its tenacious work in completing several activities with a budget still inadequate to the network's potential. The budget is approved unanimously by all present members.

12. New WAMU-NET 'regional branch' (art.1 of the Charter) at the Autonomous Province of Trento Due to the termination of collaboration with the Venice University and its UNESCO Chair, Director Eulisse announces that ADEP ('Agenzia per la Depurazione': the Water and Sewage Agency of Trentino) offered to host a new independent branch office of WAMU-NET at the premises of the Autonomous Province of Trento. This represents a unique opportunity for the network, as Director Eulisse himself could be seconded to this location without having to repay his salary (as he has always done to date) for his activities rendered to the WAMU-NET network. According to art.1 of the Charter, all present members unanimously approved the opening of a branch office at the Autonomous Province of Trento.

13. AOB - Proposals and suggestions from the Members

Discussion focuses on the next WAMU-NET activities for potential contributions of all its members.

14. Closing of the meeting

The President thanks all members for their contributions and invites those who could not attend the meeting to vote by telematic means before the deadline. The meeting closes at 16,20 CET.
