The Apulian Aqueduct (AQP - Acquedotto pugliese) was established in 1902. Since then, it stands as Europe's largest aqueduct extending in large part of southern Italy. Its mission is to ensure water supply across managed territories through an extensive network of hydraulic structures prioritizing environmental protection through purification, wastewater treatment, and composting facilities. AQP is committed to continuous improvement, addressing risks associated with climate change, and extending the management of the Integrated Water Service.

# ITALY Water Plant Milan

The Centrale dell'Acqua, was established in 1906 as part of Milan's water supply system. It evolved from a pumping station into a cultural and educational space dedicated to water and sustainability education. 

Y-40 The Deep Joy

Spanning an area of 21x18 meters, the pool Y-40® boasts a maximum depth of 42.15 meters, with various intermediate depths and caves for diving activities. The pool holds 4.3 million liters of thermal saline-bromineiodine water, maintained at a temperature between 32-34°C, allowing for swims and dives in swimwear without the need for a wetsuit. It resembles a vast cinematic set, ideal for photography sessions and advertising shoots, while also providing a safe setting for professional training and scientific research. This Italian made endeavor, completed in just 365 days, was designed by architect Emanuele Boaretto, with support from the "Boaretto Group Hotel & Resort."

The Valley of Mills

The Valley of Mills (Valle dei Mulini) is a small green oasis in the heart of the Val di Magra, in the territory of Castelnuovo, Liguria. It is traversed by the Bettigna stream and numerous smaller brooks, comprising about a square kilometer of green paths, ancient mills, and spectacular waterfalls, lying just a few steps away from the Aurelia highway. The Molicciara Social Centre started a project to enhance this forgotten hydraulic heritage through exhibitions and conferences involving both researchers and volunteers with a view to restoring the area and creating a series of tourist itineraries and educational trails on the historical uses of water.


#### The Nile Institute
